



Trenching and Excavation Training at the Youngstown Service Office

This two day training will take place on June 29 - 30

Excavation and trenching are among the most hazardous construction operations. OSHA defines an excavation as any man-made cut, cavity, trench or depression in the earth's surface formed by earth removal. A trench is defined as a narrow underground excavation that is deeper than it is wide, and is no wider than 15 feet (4.5 meters).

U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) data show that 271 workers died in trenching or excavation cave-ins from 2000 through 2006. A review of multiple national databases by NIOSH researchers found that trenching and excavation hazards during construction activities resulted in 488 deaths between 1992 and 2000 - an average of 54 fatalities each year. Sixty-eight percent of those fatalities occurred in companies with fewer than 50 workers. Forty-six percent of the deaths occurred in small companies with 10 or fewer workers. Hazards associated with trench work and excavation is recognized and preventable, yet injuries and fatalities associated with these hazards continue to occur. Regulations and consensus standards describe engineering controls, protective equipment and safe work practices to minimize hazards for workers during trench work and excavations.

Who should attend

Individual workers concerned with hazards involving trenches and excavations, competent persons and safety officers should attend.

You will learn:

- Safety techniques and methods for trenching and excavation;
- · Proper trenching and excavation design;
- About selection of protective systems for the worker;
- The decision-making process;
- Field application related to the OSHA regulation on trenching and excavation safety.

After this course, you will be able to:

- Explain and interpret 29 CFR 1926 Subpart P;
- Describe a competent person;
- Identify risk factors related to trenching and excavation sites;
- Suggest control measures to mitigate risk factors.

Special requirements:

Portions of this course are held outside. Plan to wear clothing appropriate for the weather conditions.
